

JANUARY COUNCIL NOTES Submitted by Andrew Scheele, Church Council Secretary

One of the priorities of the present council is to keep the members of The Lutheran Church of Mahomet more easily and better informed of actions taken and matters discussed at council meetings in a timely manner. For more detailed information as to the council meetings, you are welcome to take a copy of the minutes from the quad board after they are approved and posted. Minutes from the December, 2015 meeting have been approved and posted.

At the January 11th, 2016, meeting, the following motions was made and passed:

- 1. Council approved purchase of check scanner to facilitate record retention requirements for offering counting.
- 2. Council approved a continuing resolution to allow council votes via e-mail when required.

Matters discussed or decided at the January 11th, 2015 meeting were as follows:

- 1. Discussed Simple Giving, which is an easy way to allow automated deductions for church giving. Plan to present to the congregation in early 2016. There are several modules available, such as credit card acceptance and / or online portal.
- 2. Discussed the 2016 Budget. Committees are hard at work planning their work for 2016.
- 3. Discussed important dates coming up.
 - a. Planning annual meeting for 2/14. (Official announcement to follow.)
 - b. Planning ELCA Stewardship Webcast on 2/27.
 - c. Planning first communion on 3/24.
 - d. Planning installation of new members in early April.
- 4. Discussed Lent Services. Planning a healing service for lent services, including "hands on" healing.
- 5. Discussed possibly changing confirmation to a (3) year program, but then offsetting the added year by not having class during Lent and Advent.
- 6. Discussed the need to update and/or create several policies for the church, that Council plans to address in the first half of 2016 including:
 - a. The personnel policy
 - b. The IT policy
 - c. The Safe Church Policy
 - d. The Social Media Policy.

Members of the congregation are welcome to attend any council meeting. If a member wishes to present an issue to the council for consideration at a meeting, a request should be made to the president, the church council secretary, or the church office by the Tuesday prior to the meeting so that the item can be placed on the agenda. The next council meeting is Monday, February 8th, at 7:00pm.
