

### PENTECOST, THE OUTPOURING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The great 50 days of Easter rejoicing came to an end on June 8<sup>th</sup> with the celebration of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost. When we sing, "Come, Holy Spirit," we are reminded of the Spirit's coming into our lives at baptism. This festival day is both an ending and a beginning. It marks the end of the Easter season and the beginning of the longest time of the church year. The revised Church Year calendar in Evangelical Lutheran Worship refers to the Sundays following Pentecost as "Time after Pentecost," rather than "season of Pentecost."

This long time during the summer months is also referred to as the "Ordinary" time. That term is derived from the term "ordinal" or "numbered." We will find that the Sundays will be named with a number "after Pentecost."

This is the beginning of a long season of abundance and growth. Summer is a time of light, growth, play, and refreshment. The weekly gathering around word and sacrament is a sign of the abundance of growth and renewal, and bids us to a deeper understanding of community. The liturgical color is green, the color of growth and life. So come, share in the abundance of God's grace during the summer months and be enlivened by the spirit of love and mercy, which fills our lives and community.



### **Guest Speaker**

Please plan to join us on Sunday, July 20 to hear the Rev. Robert C. Schmeelcke speak at the service about a ministry of providing direct relief to the poor throughout Latin America and the Caribbean.

Pastor Schmeelcke will share personal witness about Food for the Poor's mission to care for the destitute as a means of living out the Gospel mandate to love one another.

Pastor Schmeelcke was ordained in 1969 in the New Jersey Synod for the LCA. He has served as Deal for the Delaware-Maryland and the Foothills Conference of the ELCA and as the Ecumenical Officer of the Maryland Synod of the ELCA. Pr. Schmeelcke has made mission trips to Haiti, Jamaica, El Salvador, Nicaragua and Guatemala.

Posters have been placed on the quadboard to help prepare our church family for his message. "As often as you did it to one of the least of my brothers and sisters, you did it to Me.:" (Matt 25:40)

It does, however, need to be cared for and maintained if it is going to continue to be a source of blessing to us and give honor and glory to God.

As our Congregational Work Day on Saturday, May 17, we had a good response. Some of the things that were done are as follows:

Oiled pews, baptismal font, banner and cross stands

Vacuumed the pews

Cleaned the soot area above each candle on chancel wall

Installed our new LCM church welcome signs in the community

Glued down the counter top in kitchen; installed new shelf by dishwasher

Installed smoke detectors throughout our building and a carbon monoxide

detector in the All God's Children classrooms

Debris was picked up and repairs made around our garbage/trash bin

Playground area was weeded and cleaned up

Outdoor yard work was done all around the yard and church

Soffit was repaired over the north entryway

Water drainage was redirected so as not to wash out flowers

Outdoor lights in parking lot and on building had bulbs replaced

We had a blocked sewer line that goes south from our building. Stephens Underground Solutions installed a PVC pipe cleanout so that Schoonover Sewer could complete the cleanout. This was done the week of June 5<sup>th</sup>. Cost of doing this came to over \$1000.

We had a leak in our roof over the All God's Children of our building. This was repaired by US Pro United Services.

We have volunteers who come and plant and take care of the flowers around the building to beautify our grounds. This adds so much appeal to our grounds.
