Stewardship Notes



The Lutheran Church of Mahomet family has a lot for which to be thankful! We have a vibrant, loving congregation, dedicated leadership, and two wonderful pastors. LCM is an inviting place where people can build great relationships with great people. But, while we have weathered the storm for the past few years, it seems that many of our ongoing challenges are related to not having enough active members. We see this in periodic shortages of volunteers, potential burn-out of church leaders, shortage of SS teachers, lack of participants needed to make our youth and adult education programs vibrant, etc. **Thus, we need your help and participation to re-build the church in order to maintain the activities and programs that we are accustomed to at LCM. Every church, if it is to be healthy and thrive, must grow its ranks by attracting new members to replace those who move, die, or stop attending for whatever reason.**

This is the perfect time of year for us to be inviting people to our church. Some suggested ways of doing this are:

O **Increased community awareness of LCM:** First, we should continue our efforts to increase the general awareness of LCM in the community. Our Festival booth, the yard signs, newspaper advertising, and the Live Nativity are all intended to increase that awareness. These efforts are a key part of our "being out in the community", along with more visible community assistance efforts like leaf raking, serving the Candlewood lunches, hosting outside groups like Cub Scouts and Lions Club, and assisting Mahomet Helping Hands, Salt & Light, and the Crisis Nursery.

Talk up LCM at every chance: Secondly, we should all think in terms of frequently talking to people about LCM and the worship experience through which we are blessed every Sunday. Let people know where you go to church and how much and why you enjoy it. Be positive--talk up LOGOS, talk up fellowship, talk up the puppet shows, talk up the chili cook-off, talk up Gals/Guys Nights Out, talk up All God's Children preschool. These discussions could also include comments about our upcoming Christmas season services for the Madrigals and Hanging of the Greens. The Christmas season is a very joyous and exciting time at LCM, making it easy to show others our excitement for the upcoming holiday season.

O **Invite friends and neighbors to LCM:** Thirdly, I'd like to ask each of you to invite at least one friend or neighbor to come to church as your guest over the next month or two—sooner the better. Then, you can re-invite them when we get our new pastor or for various Christmas season services. <u>This is a very important part of our overall new member efforts.</u> Preferably, these will be folks without a current church family, but not necessarily. It might take inviting several people to get one to come. However, it is my feeling that when we welcome our guests with open arms, we will have a good chance of them becoming LCM members over time. Think of how many of you are members as a result of being invited as a guest of a member. I'm certainly in that group.

Invite inactive members to worship: Finally, if you are aware of members who we haven't seen in a while, please either reach out to them yourself or let the Pastors or a Council member know the inactive member that you're thinking about and praying for.

Now is the time to grow our church—not tomorrow! We should not delay until we have a new pastor. It is primarily the congregation's job to re-build the congregation, not the pastor's. We all have a responsibility to spread the gospel by growing our flock. We can't just sit back and wait for people to magically find us--we need to proactively reach out to expand our ranks. We can do it!


TOY DRIVE



It Takes a Village was started by a few Mahomet residents about a year ago. Their families had trouble providing for their kids during Christmas. Someone took care of that for them. So they formed this group and pass it on. They rent out a storage locker on Lake of the Woods Road, and collect new and used clothes. Each month they open the locker on Thursdays so people can get clothes for their kids. Last year, they held a toy giveaway for Christmas at Grace. They had new and gently used toys and clothes available for families who registered. The families took what they needed for Christmas.

It Takes a Village also has a Facebook page that people can use to donate items or ask for help.

This year, there are already 85 families with children ages 0-18 who will need toys and clothing. The items we collect will be given away at the Dec. 7 toy giveaway for registered families at Grace Church. More information about drop off boxes and dates will be coming out in November. 
If there is not enough interest, we will consider Youth Quake Zone for Jr & Sr High students in Chicago, March 12-14, 2014.
