The woman stared down at the Church of the Beloved table with a puzzled look. Ryan Marsh -- pastor of the church -- and members of the ELCA congregation were staffing the table at the Main Street Halloween party in Edmonds, Wash. They were handing out candy to families along with the rest of the city's businesses and organizations. But on the table was also something unique, "something very 'us,' " notes Ryan: a bowl of sand bristling with tall, skinny, lit candles. "Tomorrow is All Saints Day," Ryan told the woman. "That's why tonight is called 'All Hallow's Eve' or 'Halloween.' So, if you want, you can light a candle here to pray 'thanks' to God for someone important to you." She looked intently at the bowl of sand and said, "How much?" "How much?" Now Ryan was puzzled. "How much does it cost?" she said. "It doesn't cost anything. It's free," Ryan replied. She quickly took a candle, lit it and placed it in the sand. She stood there looking at the flickering flame for a moment, and then her eyes began to well with tears. "Thank you," she said. "I needed to do that." For some people who paused at the Church of the Beloved table, this was their first experience with prayer. They would ask, "What do I say?" "It's easy," Ryan assured them. "Just say 'thank you' to God, like you would to anyone who's given you a really good gift." Children seemed to like — and get — the experience the most. The little pyromaniac boys were more excited about the prayer station than the candy. Running up to their parents they would yell, "Mom! Can I light a prayer candle? Can I?" At one point 14 children were crowded around the sand bowl saying their prayers, with parents and guardians lined up behind them. A Church of the Beloved member might ask, "So, who'd you pray for?" after a child stuck a lit candle in the sand. The answers: "My grandma's dog." "My uncle who died." "The soldiers in the war." "My dad." Assessing the success of their prayer table at the street fair, Ryan observes, "God was showing us a different way to love our neighbors. We weren't offering 'a harvest alternative to Halloween.' We weren't asking people to come into our church domain. "We were joining with the established expression of our neighborhood, in the public marketplace, alongside businesses and community services, and there, on common ground, we offered our unique way of serving Edmonds. There was nothing confrontational about it. It was what our neighborhood wanted, and it was what we had to offer: a moment of prayer and gratitude that flowed in and out of the party." By the end of the night, the three members from Beloved had handed out more than 3,000 pieces of candy and over 200 candles had been lit. Ryan says, "We were convinced that God is alive and at work in Edmonds — even on Halloween." Mid-September Call Committee Update

"Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you", I Corinthians 15:58

Greetings LCM brothers and sisters! This article is provided to share with you the past several months' activities regarding the ongoing search for a permanent pastor to join our family. In looking back, probably the last formal sharing of information took place when Assistant to the Bishop Pastor Ron Moorman visited our congregation on Sunday, February 23. Since that visit, Call Committee members had interviews and conversations with two potential pastor candidates. Between March 24 through May 28, committee members were in formal conversations with a candidate from Florida. While this process was lengthy, we were hopeful that the end result would be a good one. However, that candidate withdrew from the process after making the decision to remain with his family in the Florida area. The next candidate profile was received in mid-July. Call Committee members held one formal conversation with this candidate and were, again, very hopeful that the outcome would secure a pastor. However, that candidate elected to accept a Call with a congregation with a two senior pastor structure as he was interested in a dual partnership. He also shared that this location offered job opportunities for his wife. This process took place between July 17-23.

Since that time, Pastor Moorman has retired and a new assistant has been named. Call Committee members invited new Assistant to the Bishop Ken Sandlin to visit us here in Mahomet on Thursday, August 29. We felt it was extremely important for Pastor Sandlin to know who we are at LCM, take a tour of the Mahomet area so that he could speak directly to candidates about our wonderful town, and to take a tour of our mortgage-free beautiful church home. We also wanted to spend time talking directly with Pastor Sandlin in detail about our needs, hopes, and dreams for welcoming a new pastor to our family. We feel we accomplished this. In addition to meeting with Pastor Sandlin, Call Committee members also spent time updating our Ministry Site Profile that is currently posted to the ELCA website for candidates' review. It was important to update our profile due to the many exciting programs currently in place at LCM and to also let the reader know the incredibly positive and loving environment of our church and among our members. Again, we feel we accomplished this goal.

This week (September 17), we have again been in contact with the Synod. Pastor Sandlin has indicated that a new candidate name may be in the works. As this process continues, we cannot overestimate enough the power of prayer that a pastor is out there that is perfect for us, and we are perfect for him/her. We must continue to lift up our prayers to God for his guiding hand. We must also ask for continued patience and faith and know that He will provide. In the meantime, we will continue to give thanks for Pastor Baderschneider and Pastor Blobaum for their dedicated service to LCM and to us.

One of the priorities of the present council is to keep the members of The Lutheran Church of Mahomet more easily and better informed of actions taken and matters discussed at council meetings in a more timely manner. For more detailed information as to the council meetings, you are welcome to take a copy of the minutes from the quad board after they are approved and posted. Minutes from the August 11, 2014, meeting have been approved and posted.

A motion was made and passed at the September 3, 2014, to approve an updated Ministry Site Profile to be submitted to the synod by the call committee.

Matters discussed or decided at the September 8, 2014, meeting were as follows:

- 1. Having youth Sunday school and intergenerational lessons
- 2. The recommendation by the music and worship committee for a paid nursery attendant
- 3. The importance of a youth program and having a youth chairperson and some suggestions for the next steps in working towards that
- 4. That no beverages besides water will be allowed in the sanctuary
- 5. Having a short survey for the congregation to complete
- 6. Details about the Food for the Poor fundraiser
- 7. Putting together a team to work on a Belarus fundraiser
- 8. Open church council positions up for election in October

Members of the congregation are welcome to attend any council meeting. If a member wishes to present an issue to the council for consideration at a meeting, a request should be made to the president, the church council secretary, or the church office by the Tuesday prior to the meeting so that the item can be placed on the agenda. The next council meeting is Monday, October 13, 2014, at 7:00pm.
