Standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. ²⁶ When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, "Woman, here is your son." ²⁷ Then he said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.

As we prepare for Rally Sunday on September 13, we are reminded of our deeply familial connections to those around us. In Christ's incarnation—in his becoming fully human—we have become one body in Christ so that we can claim our status as children of God. Each person on this planet has been called into relationship with each other and to think differently about our neighbors.

One of the priorities of the present council is to keep the members of The Lutheran Church of Mahomet more easily and better informed of actions taken and matters discussed at council meetings in a timely manner. For more detailed information as to the council meetings, you are welcome to take a copy of the minutes from the quad board after they are approved and posted. Minutes from the July, 2015 meeting have been approved and posted.

At the August 10th, 2015, meeting, the following motions was made and passed: None

Matters discussed or decided at the August 10th, 2015 meeting were as follows:

8.

- 1. We are still looking at moving some of the Church's savings. Bill, Paula, and Pastor will continue to review and bring a recommendation to the council.
- 2. Discussed the roof on the Church. We did sustain hail damage from this summer's storm. The insurance company has paid our claim. We are quoting replacing the asphalt shingles for the full roof. Early indications are that the cost of full replacement are in-line with the insurance adjustors estimate and payment.
- 3. Discussed our parade float for the Sangamon River Festival in August. The trailer has been donated, and expecting good involvement from the youth in the construction.
- 4. Discussed the wheelchair lift. The installers agree the current coat rack area is the best place for installation, and it was decided this will be the location. Expected completion of the project is no later than Thanksgiving.
- 5. Discussed the integration of the ELW's into the worship service. Music and Worship proposed a plan that will slowly introduce the congregation to the ELW.
- 6. Discussed re-starting youth Sunday School. Pastor Nikoli suggested a curriculum that is easy for guest teachers to run with. The council agreed with the curriculum and are hoping it will add to the participation rate of members teaching youth Sunday School.
- 7. Discussed All God's Children, and the need for us to have more alignment in our identity. Planning to have direct discussions between council and All God's Children in the coming months.

Members of the congregation are welcome to attend any council meeting. If a member wishes to present an issue to the council for consideration at a meeting, a request should be made to the president, the church council secretary, or the church office by the Tuesday prior to the meeting so that the item can be placed on the agenda. The next council meeting is Monday, September 14th, 2015, at 7:00pm.

A Heart in Tune with God Sings Melodies of Praise Psalm 98:1

O sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvelous things. His right hand and his holy arm have gotten him victory.

The phrase "new song" comes to us from the Psalms, where it appears six times. Four of these are invitations to sing to the Lord a new song (33:3, 96:1, 98:1, 149:1). One is a statement by the Psalmist that he will sing a new song (144:9). The other instance, identifies the source of a new song: "[The Lord] put a new song in my mouth" (40:3).

Biblical scholars see two possible meanings of the phrase "new song" (*shir chadash* in Hebrew). Some emphasize the literal newness of the lyrics. Others explain that a new song needn't be recently written. The psalmist can use this language to refer to a familiar song sung with new meaning and passion. Both literal and figurative meanings of "new song" may well be present in the Psalms.

Though Psalm 98 is about God freeing the Israelites from slavery, it is prophetically also about our salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord. And as we remember what God has done for us, we can trust God to help us with today's difficulties as well as tomorrow's uncertainties.

No matter the precise interpretation of "new song", the Psalms reveal that a new song comes from a fresh experience with God.

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that out of the world's population, 4% die attending movies, 8% die eating in fast food restaurants, 10% die in home accidents, 18% die from smoking, 20% die in bars, lounges and taverns, 40% die from accidents, misc., but only 1 out of 75 million people die in choir rehearsal!
