These issues require a majority vote of those members present and voting, and a current list of members eligible to vote will be available at the meeting. If you have any question about whether you are eligible to vote, please contact the church office or Sharon Yeakel at sbyeakel@gmail.com.

Please note, as constitutionally defined, "Voting members shall be confirmed members. Such confirmed members shall have communed and made a contribution of record during the current or preceding year." Therefore, voting members should have a record both of taking communion and making an individual contribution from January 1, 2012, forward. For the purpose of this congregational meeting, communion attendance must be recorded and contributions must be received no later than Sunday, October 13, 2013. Also in accordance with the constitution, voting by proxy or absentee ballot shall not be permitted.


